

FM Transmitter Wireless Cup Bluetooth4.2 Car Radio Adapter Handsfree USB Charger

Introduction

Hello valued customers! We have noticed many of you have been having trouble getting this product to work. This guide will teach you how to setup, install, and show you how the item functions. Many users are experiencing connectivity issues and are also having audio issues such as static or no response.

Product Features

- This device allows you to connect your Bluetooth device to your car FM stereo. Make sure your device has Bluetooth enabled
- You can listen to audio messages such as GPS navigation
- Ability to answer calls hands-free with the built-in mic
- Can charge devices via USB port
- Fits easily into cup holder

Installation

First, you can turn on the FM transmitter by plugging it into the cigarette lighter.

Next, you will have to scroll through the FM frequencies on your vehicle and make sure it is unused (Pick one that is not occupied by a local radio station). Once you have found an empty frequency channel, you have to change the frequency on the FM transmitter to match the frequency of your car. Be sure to note down the frequency numbers in case you forget.

Once the vehicle and the FM transmitter is on the same frequency, you can connect your Bluetooth device to the transmitter. Turn on Bluetooth and pair it to the transmitter.

Turn on your media on the Bluetooth device. You should be able to hear playback from your car's stereo system.

To answer phone calls, simply press the center button (phone logo). Press the button again to hang up the call. Press it twice in succession to dial the last called number.

Common Problems

Some users might experience an issue with static or poor audio quality. To limit static, you should control the volume on your car's stereo system. Do not use the phone to control volume. Also, do not place the Bluetooth device close to the FM transmitter. Keep the distance at least one passenger seat away. The Bluetooth device might be interfering with the transmitter signal.

If audio quality is still poor, it may be due to poor reception from frequency. Please switch to a different frequency and try again. It is recommended to use frequencies at the lower end of your car's stereo system. Also, the audio issue can come from the device. Try to pair it with a different device and see if you have the same problem.

If you are having problems turning on the transmitter, it may be a problem with your power port. Example if the transmitter is turning on and off, it may be an issue with the 12V socket. Please try another vehicle and see if you have the same problem.
